Public health professionals use advanced data, skills and technology to assess local and global health problems and then develop appropriate solutions to prevent recurrences.

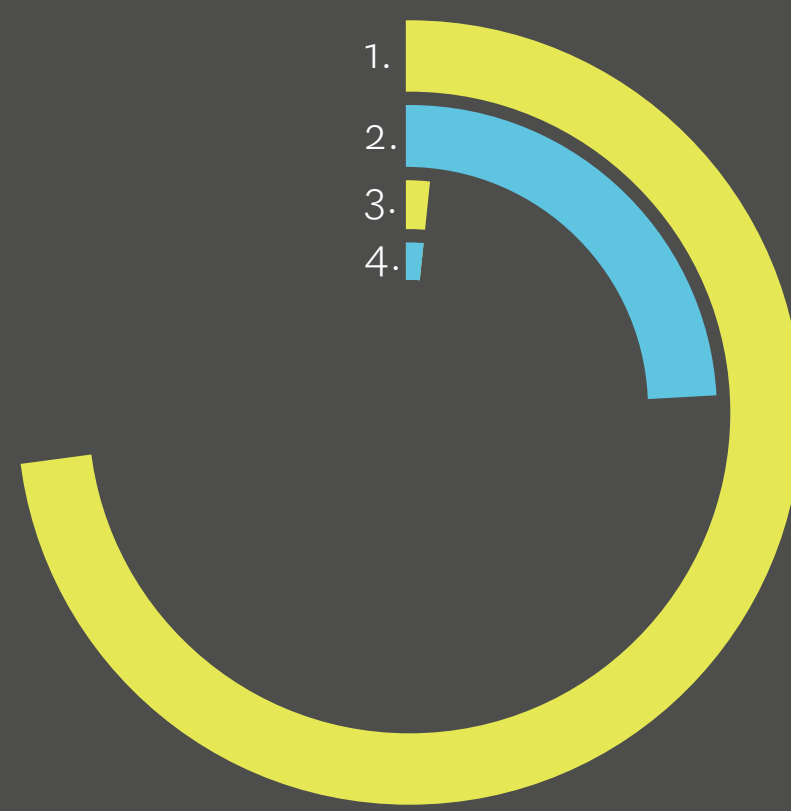


Impact

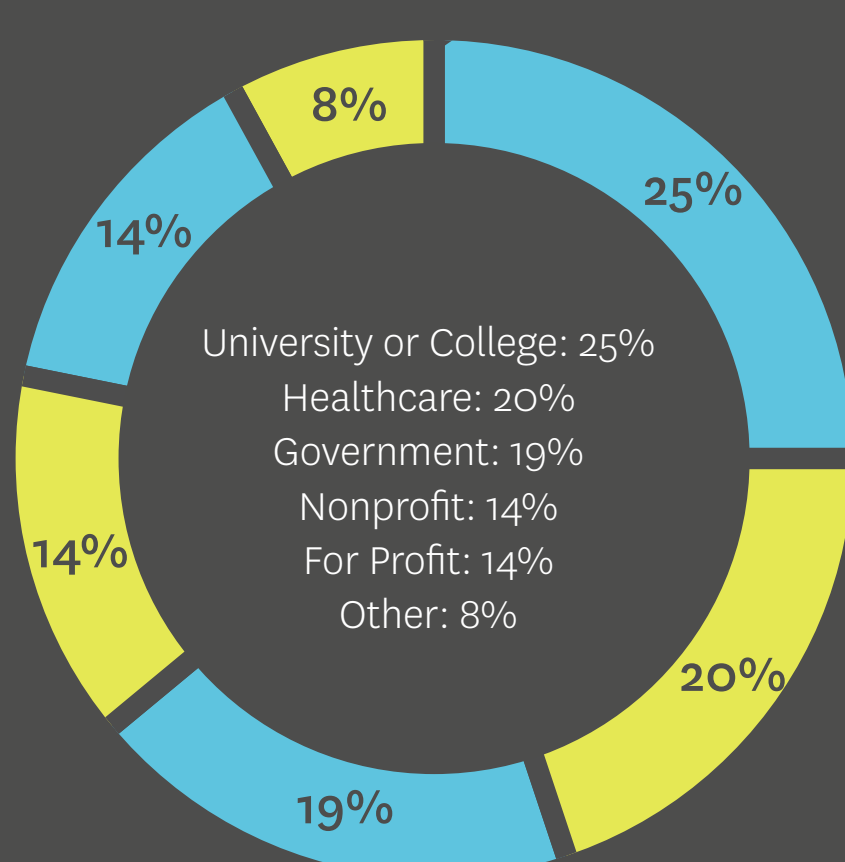
